SED 458 : METHODS AND PROCEDURES: DEAF AND HARD OF HEARING

This course for senior Deaf and Hard-of-Hearing majors focuses on educational practices in both public and residential school programs for students who are deaf and hard of hearing. Specific researchsupported instructional strategies and organization as well as the SC Standards, are examined and practiced. Emphasis is placed on the roles and responsibilities of the teacher as decision-maker, facilitator of cognitive and communicative development, multidisciplinary team member, collaborator with parents and other professionals, and advocate for students. The course includes a 25-hour clinical. Offered Fall Term 3.000
